

# LMHS' Year of Expansion Improves the Health of the Community

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) increased its scope of care in 2016 to meet the community's growing healthcare needs. For multiple reasons (such as increased population, increased number of older adults, long travel times to Columbus, and emerging treatment options), more patients are turning to LMHS each year. The 2016 expansion projects included the opening of new facilities and the addition of new community programs.

## LMHS' growth in 2016 was most visible through the development of three new facilities and launch of three new initiatives:

1. Construction began on the Gerald K. McClain Building, located at 20 West Locust Street in Downtown Newark. The two-story, 25,500-square-foot building's ribbon-cutting took place on January 30, 2017, nearly one year after breaking ground in February 2016. The land for the project was generously donated by General Contractor Gerald "Jerry" McClain, President of The Jerry McClain Companies. The \$8 million building was constructed under the management of Roger McClain, Vice President of McClain Development. Initially, the building will be occupied by Licking Memorial Hospital Urgent Care and Licking Memorial Family Practice. The building also can accommodate another physician practice.
2. The Licking Memorial Medical Campus, located at 1717 West Main Street in Newark, celebrated its grand opening in September 2016. The Center for Sight, Licking Memorial Orthopedic Surgery and Licking Memorial Family Practice were the initial occupants of the 3,260-square-foot building.

3. LMHS opened the For Your Health Center at Washington Square in May 2016 as a means of addressing health-related questions from Washington Square Apartments residents. The Health Center is staffed by a registered nurse, dietitian and pharmacist on a rotating basis to advise residents on making appointments with providers, acquiring referrals, researching health information, and finding financial assistance and transportation for health care.

4. The LMHS Active•Senior Program kicked off with a dance event in June 2016 that featured music from the 40s, 50s, 60s and 70s. A Brunch Walk with rheumatologist Hufza Hanif, M.D., which was held at Rotary Park in August, also was an Active•Senior event.

5. LMHS administered free influenza vaccines at the first "Be Wise ... Immunize" children's flu clinic. Infants and children were vaccinated at the clinic which took place at the Newark Advocate office in Downtown Newark on November 5.
6. Thirty-seven high school seniors had an opportunity to gain an inside understanding of health care by attending LMHS' first Camp Med in August. The students took tours of various departments at Licking Memorial Hospital, participated in hands-on demonstrations and discussed healthcare careers with medical professionals.

# Changes, Enhancements and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is dedicated to keeping abreast of medical advances and improving the healthcare experience for patients and their families. In many instances, the changes are subtle and take place without public awareness. Changes and improvements at LMHS over the past year include:

## LMH Implements Proactive Patient Monitoring Technology

In a continued effort to optimize patient care, and ensure safety and efficiency for patients as well as medical staff, Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) implemented new clinical technology.

- **EarlySense**

In 2016, LMH became the first hospital in the state to implement EarlySense. The continuous and contact-free monitoring system is a tool that assists clinicians in early detection of patient deterioration and in identifying and preventing potential adverse events, including Code Blue emergencies, preventable ICU transfers, patient falls and pressure ulcers. EarlySense's patented sensor and advanced algorithms monitor and analyze cardiac, respiratory, sleep and motion parameters. LMH is one of only 15 hospitals in the United States to use this innovative technology.

- **Connex Vital Signs Monitor with Early Warning Score**

The Connex Vital Signs Monitor (CVSM) is an advanced, portable touch screen vital sign monitor that provides clinicians with real-time vital sign data as well as Early Warning Scores (EWS) to help them proactively implement clinical interventions when appropriate and improve Electronic Medical Record (EMR) documentation. EWS is a guide used by clinical staff to quickly determine the severity of a patient's condition. An increased EWS results in an escalated response from the clinicians. EWS actions range from continuing to monitor the patient without any needed actions, to notifying the attending physician and consider calling a Rapid Response. The CVSM monitors will be used to not only collect vital sign data and calculate a EWS, but it also will be used to document intake and output data directly into the EMR at the patient's bedside.

- **Hercules Patient Repositioning System**

The Hercules System improves caregiver safety, increases caregiver efficiency and enhances the patient experience. Patients weighing up to 500 lbs. can be repositioned with the simple push of a button, eliminating the lifting and pulling that can cause back, neck and shoulder injuries for clinical staff. Only one caregiver is required to reposition a patient, who moves with the sheet, reducing the friction that can cause skin shearing and tears. Repositioning can be completed in 10 seconds, providing nearly immediate relief on pressure points and improving patient comfort.

## New Cardiovascular Information System Improves Patient Care

The Cardiology Department at Licking Memorial Hospital invested in a cardiovascular information system (CVIS), an all-digital platform that improves patient care and productivity by consolidating disparate processes into a single workspace. While producing more efficient diagnoses, treatment and storage of patient data, it also offers speedier turnaround times for test results, and shorter wait times. CVIS includes Centricity Cardio Workflow (CCW) and Centricity Cardio Imaging (CCI), which integrate seamlessly. Together, the two software applications allow for physicians and other medical staff to access a single, comprehensive patient record and use relevant information more efficiently than ever before.

## Shuttle MVP Delivers Comprehensive Rehabilitation

The Shuttle MVP machine, which functions as a versatile rehabilitation tool, is the latest addition to the LMH Physical Therapy Department. Physical therapy patients and professional athletes alike use the Shuttle MVP to develop muscle strength and control while minimizing harsh joint impact. A wide variety of patients can benefit from its use, particularly those recovering from knee or ankle injuries, as well as those who are experiencing back pain or general weakness. The equipment addition allows for physical therapy sessions to be scheduled locally. The Shuttle MVP also can assist senior patients in improving overall strength and coordination in a controlled environment, allowing them to approach their everyday tasks with confidence.

## DBT Technology Ensures Most Accurate Mammogram

Digital Breast Tomosynthesis (DBT), also known as 3D Mammography, has been obtained to ensure the most accurate mammogram available for LMH patients. A DBT exam is far more accurate in earlier breast cancer detection than any other mammogram, capturing

multiple slices (images) of the breast, and creating a layered 3D image. Radiologists are able to review the breast, one thin slice at a time, similar to turning pages in a book, which assists with a more accurate diagnosis. Unlike a 2D traditional mammography of which a physician only can view one top image of the breast, the DBT exam allows for more detail to be seen, thus providing a view of all complexities of the breast tissue in a flat image.

## Procalcitonin Testing Supports Early Sepsis Diagnosis and Treatment

Procalcitonin (PCT) testing was made available in the LMH Laboratory. Laboratory testing for elevated levels of PCT can lead to the early diagnosis of severe bacterial infection or sepsis. PCT Testing can be utilized in the Emergency Department, as well as within the Intensive Care Unit, where sepsis is commonly encountered. Physicians can receive results in just 20 minutes.

In addition, PCT testing helps physicians decide whether or not to prescribe antibiotics, as well as determine when it is safe for a patient to discontinue antibiotics following an infection. PCT testing also can help to determine whether or not antibiotics are working properly. These efforts can aid in cost reduction and prevention against unnecessary exposure to antibiotics.

## New Software Helping Improve Quality of Care for Breast Cancer Patients

The Hospital installed Aspen Breast, a software program that helps to organize information about a patient and enables radiologists to easily track a person from the first breast screening through treatment and beyond. With Aspen, patient history, laboratory results and information on treatment is gathered and compiled in easy to use files. With the program, radiologists can ensure a patient in need of more testing or a biopsy is informed right away. Aspen not only helps ensure that a patient is never lost

in the system, it also can be used to track the process. The Hospital can get a better sense of the timing of treatment and the demographics of the patients. Since installing Aspen, LMH staff has been able to reduce the amount of time to receive a biopsy from over two weeks to under one week.

## Anesthesia Procedure Used Successfully to Help PTSD Patients

The Licking Memorial Hospital Anesthesiology Department is now able to help patients suffering from post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) by performing a stellate ganglion block procedure. The stellate ganglion is a collection of sympathetic nerves in the neck. A local anesthetic is injected into the area to block those nerves. The procedure usually is used to reduce pain and swelling, and improve mobility. However, it was discovered that the right-sided stellate ganglion block is highly effective in treatment of PTSD. Following the block, biochemical changes ensue in the right amygdala region of the brain. The changes last at least one to three months, and if symptoms recur, the patient can receive another block.

In addition to the block, ketamine and nitrous oxide, anesthetic agents with euphorogenic effects, used in subanesthetic doses can be used in the treatment of refractory depression and suicidal ideation. LMH also offers these treatment modalities.

Many community members have shared their appreciation for having access to outstanding healthcare resources available locally.

## Mark Stewart, D.D.S. – Heart Care



"After a chemical stress test produced abnormal results, Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., explained that I was suffering from severe ischemia – inadequate blood supply – on the right side of my heart. While there was no damage yet, there would be soon if I did not receive care. Dr. Rajjoub personally explained everything to my wife, Lori, and I and put us at ease as best he could. The entire staff was so pleasant and helpful. Following radial angioplasty, I underwent an arterial stent procedure in the LMH Cardiac Catheterization Lab. It was discovered that I had a 99 percent blockage in my right coronary artery. The radial procedure was so much more comfortable than the traditional angioplasty, which inserts the catheter

through the patient's groin. Dr. Rajjoub met with Lori immediately upon completion, explaining that I was a very fortunate man and that the procedure undoubtedly prevented a heart attack. I have high praises for the skilled and talented Cardiac Catheterization Lab team as well as the Hospital staff who were attentive and kind to both me and my family."

## Scott Davis – Cancer Care

"As my wife, Kim, and I came to terms with the diagnosis of stage 3-B colorectal cancer, we found great comfort in the LMH staff's care. They were not just doing their jobs. I could tell that they genuinely care about their patients and go 'above and beyond' anytime they can. Gastroenterologist David E. Subler, M.D., performed a flexible sigmoidoscopy in the GI Lab and discovered that a tumor



was blocking my colon. General Surgeon Brent M. Savage, M.D., performed surgery to remove the tumor, as well as the affected portion of my colon where the tumor had grown through the intestinal wall. Dr. Savage then performed a colostomy with the hope that it would be temporary. I soon met with Hematologist/Oncologist Aruna C. Gowda, M.D., to develop a treatment strategy. She and the whole Oncology staff were awesome. They gave me a feeling of hope and made the chemotherapy process feel like normal life. They motivated me to be positive about the experience. At my twelfth and final session, the Oncology staff presented me with a cake to help celebrate. Dr. Savage performed a colonoscopy a few weeks later and found no traces of cancer. Throughout the previous nine months, Kim and I had developed a deep respect and trust for Dr. Savage. I learned so much about the journey of cancer treatment. I thought it was going to be horrific, but there was a whole team of very caring professionals there with me every step of the way."

## Joseph Harig – Emergency Care

"I came to a crowded Emergency Department (ED) with extreme abdominal pain. I could hardly walk and thought I had an appendicitis. All of the staff were very professional and compassionate, never showing any signs of stress due to the high volume of patients. Even though both waiting rooms were full, I was attended to almost immediately, thanks to Physician Assistant (PA) Cameron Evans who initiated my care. Cameron completed my evaluation, drew blood, started an IV and scheduled the necessary CT scan. He was very proficient and had a wonderful rapport with the nurses and staff! I was diagnosed with a severe intestinal infection and treated with antibiotics. The coordination and communication between the ED and my physicians was excellent. I felt empowered by the care that I received, along with the way the staff communicated with me and supported each other. I will certainly recommend LMH to anyone in need of care. I cannot say enough about the decision to utilize PAs in the ED. Whoever came up with this idea certainly was thinking outside of the box. It is a very proactive move that shows why LMH is a leader among Central Ohio hospitals."



## Joe Joyce – Diabetes Care

"In the spring of 2015, I started having migraines. I did not want anything to interfere with our family's upcoming trip to Disney World, so I began taking migraine medication and felt relief. During vacation, Florida temperatures soared, so I did not consider my unquenchable thirst and dry mouth unusual. About three weeks after returning home, I experienced yet another unusual symptom, blurred vision. A fasting blood glucose test performed at Licking Memorial Urgent Care – Granville revealed remarkably high numbers and I was diagnosed with Type 2 diabetes. I was referred to I-Tsyr Shaw, M.D., of Licking Memorial Endocrinology, who immediately helped me begin to control my diabetes with medication. I received a consult from LMH Community Case Management dietitian Annmarie Thacker who was fantastic! She totally changed the way I thought about eating and was the biggest help to me in this process. Annmarie helped me understand that it is not really what you eat, but how much you eat. I am very grateful for all the help and support I have received from the LMH staff."

## Ed Lewis – Surgical Care

"After purchasing a new pair of shoes before a recent vacation to Florida, I developed a blister. I tried to doctor it myself for a week, but it clearly needed medical attention, so I made an appointment when I returned home. Garth Bennington, M.D., referred me to the Emergency Department due to the severity of the infection and the fact that I was diabetic, and I was admitted to the Hospital. When the tip of my toe turned black, Robert Mueller, M.D., of Licking Memorial Orthopedic Surgery, declared that surgery was necessary to amputate my toe. He explained the



procedure and recovery thoroughly. He is very good with his patients one-on-one and I was comforted. I had a lot of questions and he was more than patient with me. Upon my discharge, Dr. Mueller's office provided a wooden shoe to assist with my post-surgery mobility and offered helpful recommendations for protective footwear. I feel so blessed with the care I received at LMH. I do not know why patients would travel to Columbus for care, unless it was essential."

## Christina Boeshart – Behavioral Health Care

"My husband, Carl, and I were thrilled with the birth of our son, Logan, in 2011. I was initially excited to learn that I was expecting another baby a couple of years later, but those feelings decreased early in my pregnancy. I did not want my pregnancy any longer. I still kept all the appointments with my OB/GYN and took care of myself, but I was just going through the motions. They say that with peri- or post-partum depression, you detach from the infant. In my case, I felt so guilty about not wanting the pregnancy that I focused all my attention on my newborn daughter, and became detached from my son, who was just 2 1/2 years old at the time. I still took care of him, but mentally – I was not there. During my annual exam at Licking Memorial Women's Health, my physician noticed that I did not seem my normal self and prescribed an antidepressant. While initially it helped, one year later, the symptoms of depression returned, and my family physician referred me to Elizabeth A. Yoder, D.O., of Licking Memorial Outpatient Psychiatric Services. Dr. Yoder prescribed a different antidepressant medication and began counseling sessions with me. Things are good at home now. When things start to get a little hectic with the kids, I can take a step back and manage my negative thoughts. It helps me enjoy my children and being a mom."

# Fundraising

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) relies, in part, on charitable donations to proactively incorporate technological advances and meet growing community needs. The Development Department at Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) works diligently to ensure that the Hospital has the funds available for continuous improvements. Contributions to Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF) are used to purchase equipment and to fund programs, capital expenses, and facility improvements. The contributions are not used for salaries or general operating expenses.

**Community Cornerstone Club** – The Community Cornerstone Club is comprised of individuals and businesses who contribute \$100 or more to LMHF. As of 2016, the Cornerstone Club has 222 members who raised \$38,950 toward the new LMHS medical facility in Downtown Newark. Donors receive a Main Street Collection recognition piece at each \$500 milestone of giving. The 2016 addition to the Main Street Collection recognizes donors who have reached the \$9,000 level of giving. The new piece is a replica of the Rod Callander Memorial Aquarium in the LMH Hematology/Oncology Department waiting area.

**The Caduceus Society** – Physicians have a special opportunity to lend financial support through The Caduceus Society, which is a prestigious giving level for physicians who pledge a gift of \$10,000 or more over a period of 10 years. Personalized bricks are available in two sizes and are placed in one of LMH's exterior walkways. A total of six commemorative bricks were purchased and placed on the grounds in 2016.

# Employment

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) has provided employment opportunities for Licking County residents for more than 118 years. LMHS is the primary healthcare provider in Licking County, and it has established a reputation as the leading healthcare provider in the community. This distinction is largely due to the dedication of the Health Systems' 2,000-plus employees who serve diligently to provide quality care for patients and visitors.

LMHS has high standards for its employees and believes in recognizing and rewarding their accomplishments through various celebrations, including monthly Dining with the Stars recognition breakfasts and luncheons, bimonthly employee birthday events, and annual recognition dinners. LMHS also offers a comprehensive benefits package that includes tuition assistance, free uniforms and free access to various wellness center sites, as well as excellent health, dental and vision insurance.

**LMHS Ranked among the Nation's Top 20 Best Workplaces in Health Care** – Fortune and Great Place to Work® released their evaluations after nearly 30,000 healthcare employees in the United States responded anonymously to surveys about their workplace environment.
