Throughout 2024, LMHS has continued to focus on providing outstanding care to the community which consists of our family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers. Our mission to improve the health of the community is a personal one, and our goal to maintain independence is a priority.

LMH consistently receives excellent performance ratings, as evidenced by the comparative measure data shared throughout the year and many awards. Such achievements overcome the misconception that patients need to travel to a large, multi-hospital group to receive top quality healthcare. Over the past few years, LMHS has become more focused on the impact of the social drivers of health, such as transportation, food insecurity, and housing. Health disparities arise when community members struggle to find transportation in order to receive medical care. Higher prices at the grocery store also place a strain on families. We have learned that removing obstacles to obtaining fresh produce and transportation services is vital to creating a healthy,

thriving community, and improves health as well as quality of life.

As an independent, community health system, LMHS is better able to connect with other non-profit organizations and form partnerships that benefit Licking County. In 2024, LMHS continued to evaluate transportation needs in regard to physician appointments, and look for new ways to assist local residents in obtaining transportation. LMHS supported Licking County Transit which now has four bus routes that offer residents the needed transportation to visit with physicians to receive care and access to stores that offer fresh produce and healthy food choices. Increasing availability of healthy fruits and vegetables was also a top priority. In partnership with the Food Pantry Network of Licking County, LMHS assisted in the establishment of a food pantry on the west side of Newark that offers multiple fresh produce options. Working with FPN also ensures that residents have better access to the groceries they need.



Of course, it is important for a healthcare organization to be financially strong. Our financial strength allows us to upgrade equipment and technology, hire highly qualified staff, purchase quality supplies, expand services, and maintain our facilities.

I am sincerely grateful to the many individuals for their roles in helping LMH and LMHS remain successfully independent, including our loyal patients who spread the word of the excellent care they receive. The

donors' contributions allow our facilities to add many amenities that create a comforting, healing Hospital environment. Members of the LMH and LMHS Boards of Directors are local residents who work diligently to ensure that top quality care and services are provided that meet the community's healthcare needs. # Changes, Enhancements, and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) implements the best modern medical advances to improve healthcare experiences and outcomes for patients. Changes may be subtle and take place without public awareness. Enhancements and modifications at LMHS over the past year include:

## Tamarack 2000 Renovations

In 2024, additional renovations were made to Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) – Tamarack to create more efficient operation routines, provide additional surgery options, and promote better utilization of space. The changes accommodate additional surgery options for elective orthopedic procedures that were previously not offered at Tamarack 2000, such as carpal tunnel surgery, arthroscopy for the knee, shoulder, ankle, and wrist, and tendon repair.

Renovations to the building included a new sterile supply area, relocation of locker rooms and associated bathrooms near the operating rooms, and the addition of a dictation room with two workstations for surgeons. The reception area, surgery manager's office space, and a break room were also renovated to provide a much-needed consultation room where surgeons can meet with the patient's family in private.

## Licking Memorial Cardiac Electrophysiology and New Electrophysiology Equipment

LMHS recently added a new specialty physician practice, Licking Memorial Cardiac Electrophysiology, to expand access to cardiovascular services within the community. John J. Keller, M.D., joined the practice in August as LMHS' first electrophysiologist. His expertise allows LMHS to provide comprehensive cardiac services, including ablations and implantable EP devices for patients who suffer from heart arrhythmia.

LMHS installed new state-of-the-art equipment to enhance and improve the Cardiac Electrophysiology staff's ability to recognize and treat arrhythmias originating in the upper two chambers, or atria, of the heart. The new technology, including the Nitron Cryoconsole, the Abbott SensiTherm Multi-esophageal Monitoring System, the Boston Science Medical RF Puncture Generator, the Abbott Ensite X EP System, the Abbott View Mate Intracardiac Ultrasound, and GE ComboLab, allows for cardiac ablation and other electrophysiology procedures to be performed more safely and efficiently.

## Inari ClotTriever Catheter System

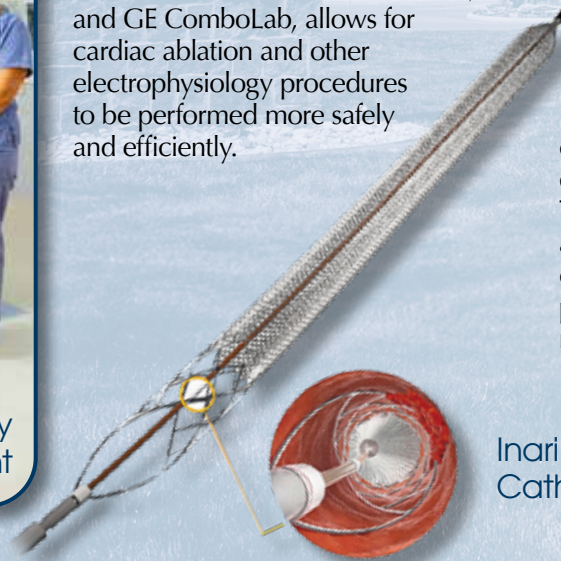
Licking Memorial Vascular Surgery has expanded the service offerings for patients diagnosed with deep vein thrombosis (DVT). The ClotTriever system is targeted to remove large clots without the need for thrombolytic drug therapy or admission to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The system may be used in either the upper or lower parts of the body. The procedure begins with a small incision in the skin, most commonly the leg. A sheath is inserted into the vein, allowing the delivery of wires and catheters that are used to navigate and reach the clot. Once the catheter reaches the location of the clot, the surgeons can capture and remove the clot utilizing a coring element and collection bag contained within the catheter. The procedure typically lasts one to two hours, and patients often feel symptom relief immediately following.

## Drug-coated Balloon Angioplasty

LMH began offering drug-coated balloon (DCB) angioplasty to patients in September. The new technology offers an alternative to the insertion of a second metal stent. The DCB offers an effective treatment strategy for the management of coronary in-stent restenosis, a re-narrowing of the treated artery. The specialized coronary devices are comprised of a balloon catheter with an engineered coating that allows the delivery of a medical agent directly to the vessel wall during an angioplasty. The medication used in the coating is an anti-proliferative agent, which inhibits the cells from growing. The procedure may be performed as outpatient surgery and requires minimal recovery time.

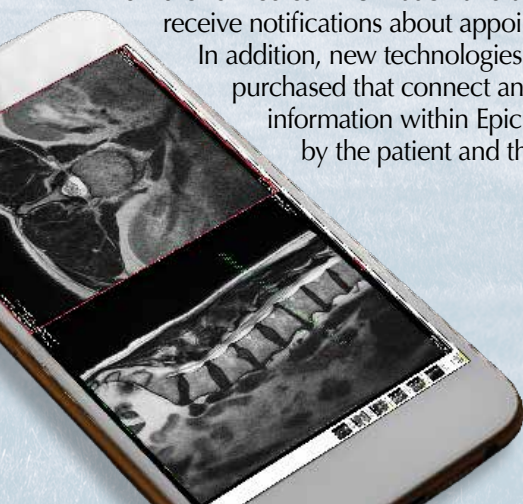


## Intravenous (IV) Integration System and Capsule Medical Device Expansion

LMHS invested in new equipment to improve efficiency and quality of care in the LMH Emergency Department, patient care units, and operating rooms, as well as the post anesthesia care unit (PACU) and surgical recovery rooms at LMH – Tamarack. The equipment included IV clinical integration technology and an expansion of the use of the Capsule Medical Device Information Platform. The IV integration system enables management of IV medication delivery by linking smart infusion pumps, the medication order, patient information, and the electronic health record, Epic, to ensure the correct IV medication at the prescribed dosage and rate is administered to the proper patient and seamlessly documented into the medical record. The process reduces the occurrence of medication errors and adverse events. Capsule Medical Device Information Platform improves clinical decision making and workflow by integrating data from several medical devices such as ventilators, continuous dialysis machines, balloon pumps, and the Arctic Sun Hypothermia machine.

## Picture Archiving and Communication System (PACS) Now Available in MyChart

To improve the quality of care, LMHS continues to optimize the use of the electronic health record, Epic. Patients can now view a variety of diagnostic images including scans, ultrasounds, mammograms, and X-rays. Parents have more access to their children's medical information and all patients can receive notifications about appointments, etc. In addition, new technologies have been purchased that connect and track patient information within Epic for easier access by the patient and their care team.



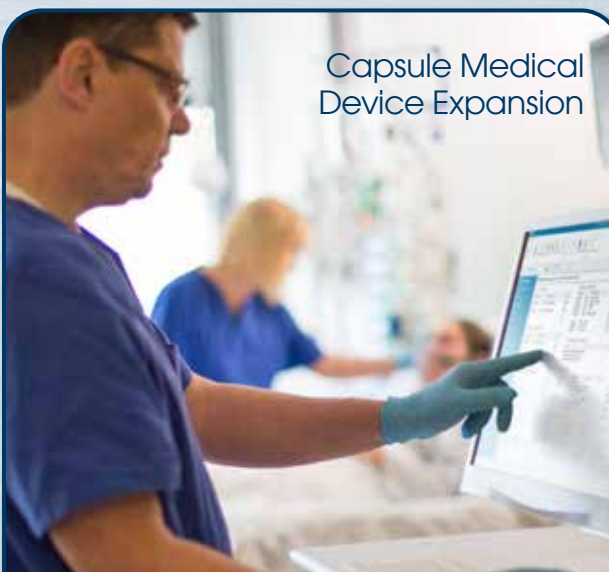

## Siemens Atellica Analyzer

The LMH Laboratory implemented new chemistry equipment that conducts a wide range of chemistry and immunoassay tests to deliver more efficient, faster results, diagnoses, and enhanced patient care. The Atellica Analyzer combines two modules – CH (Chemistry) and IM (Immunoassay) – to perform extensive testing that is critical in diagnosing various health conditions such as diabetes, infections, and cancer. The system allows Medical Laboratory Scientists to run all necessary tests in one location without switching between analyzers. Its larger capacity can accommodate more tests in less time, creating faster results to help physicians and other healthcare providers make quicker decisions and begin treatment without delay. The new technology has been integrated into the Laboratory's current track system that transports samples through the various testing modules. It can also be expanded in the future to allow the Laboratory to run tests that are currently outsourced to other labs.

## Point-of-care Analyzers

For critically ill patients in the ICU, top quality patient care demands quick analysis, efficiency, and extensive information to identify proper treatment. LMHS invested in portable analyzers that allow nurses to perform electrolyte, glucose, and blood gas testing at the patient's bedside in the ICU, using only a small amount of blood. Results are available in less than a minute and provide the physician with vital information to assist in treatment decisions. In addition, the analyzers are designed to communicate with Epic, sending the results directly to the patient's chart.

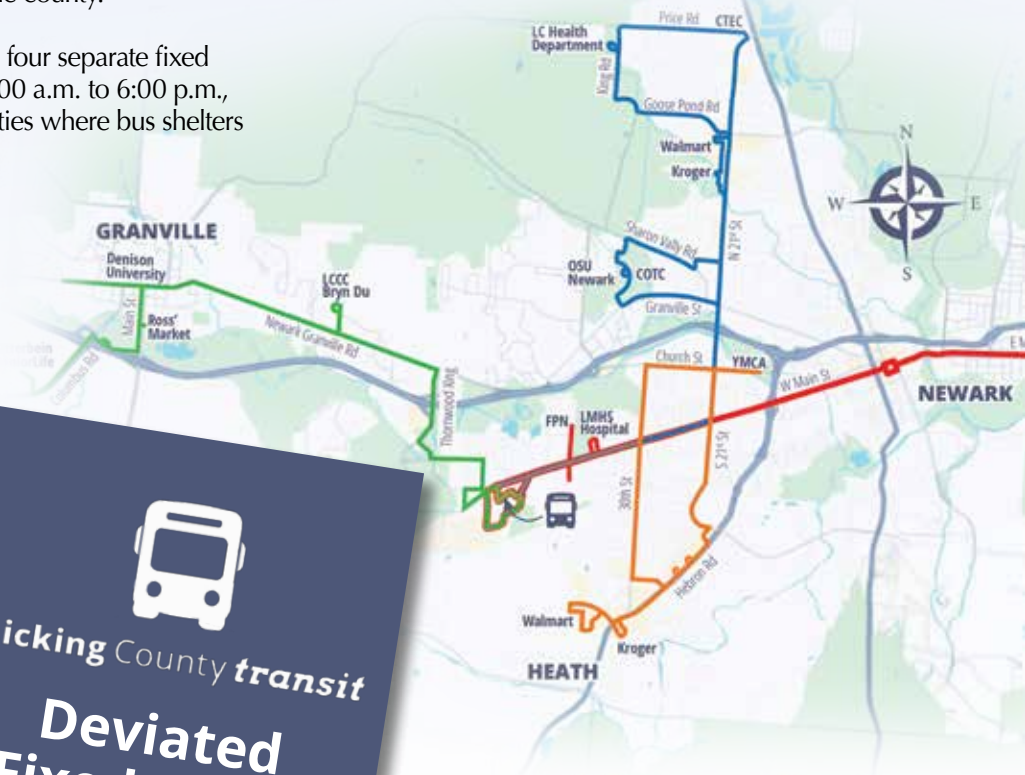
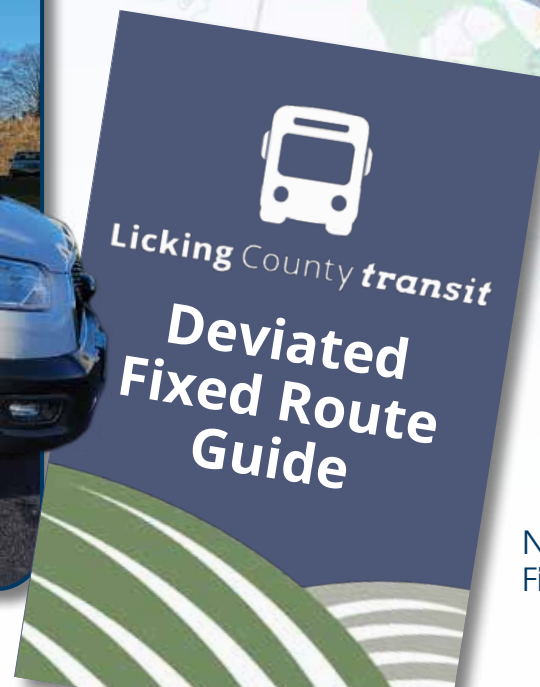
# Proud to Serve All with Dedicated Care

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is dedicated to the mission of improving the health of the community by offering the best quality care and ensuring residents are able to maintain a healthy lifestyle. The organization has recently begun to focus on how social drivers, such as housing, food insecurity, and transportation, affect community health and are taking steps to reduce health disparities in Licking County. Life expectancy rates in Licking County vary greatly from zip code to zip code, a statistic that many cities share throughout the United States. Such variations are due to socioeconomic disparities such as income, education, and occupations. Rising housing costs and inflation also cause strain on families' budgets, leaving less money for food, healthcare, and other expenses.

The availability and affordability of transportation are intertwined with housing location. Health implications of limited public transportation include missed or delayed healthcare appointments, decreased prescription compliance, and increased health expenditures, leading to poorer health outcomes. To avoid such outcomes, LMHS has been working to assist community members with transportation. LMH Ride was established in 2019, providing free transportation for non-emergent healthcare appointments. In addition, LMHS worked with Licking County Transit to establish bus transportation throughout the county.

The bus service, which includes four separate fixed routes, now runs hourly from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and stops at several LMHS facilities where bus shelters

have been erected for riders' use. The LMHS Medical Campus located at 1717 West Main Street serves as a hub for all the routes. LMHS provided funds to subsidize the bus service through the first year of operation to allow residents free access. The first route travels along Main Street in Newark to the Licking County Aging Program/Heritage Hall. The additional routes connect the Licking Memorial Medical Campus hub to Granville, North 21st Street, and Heath where shopping and other needed services are available.

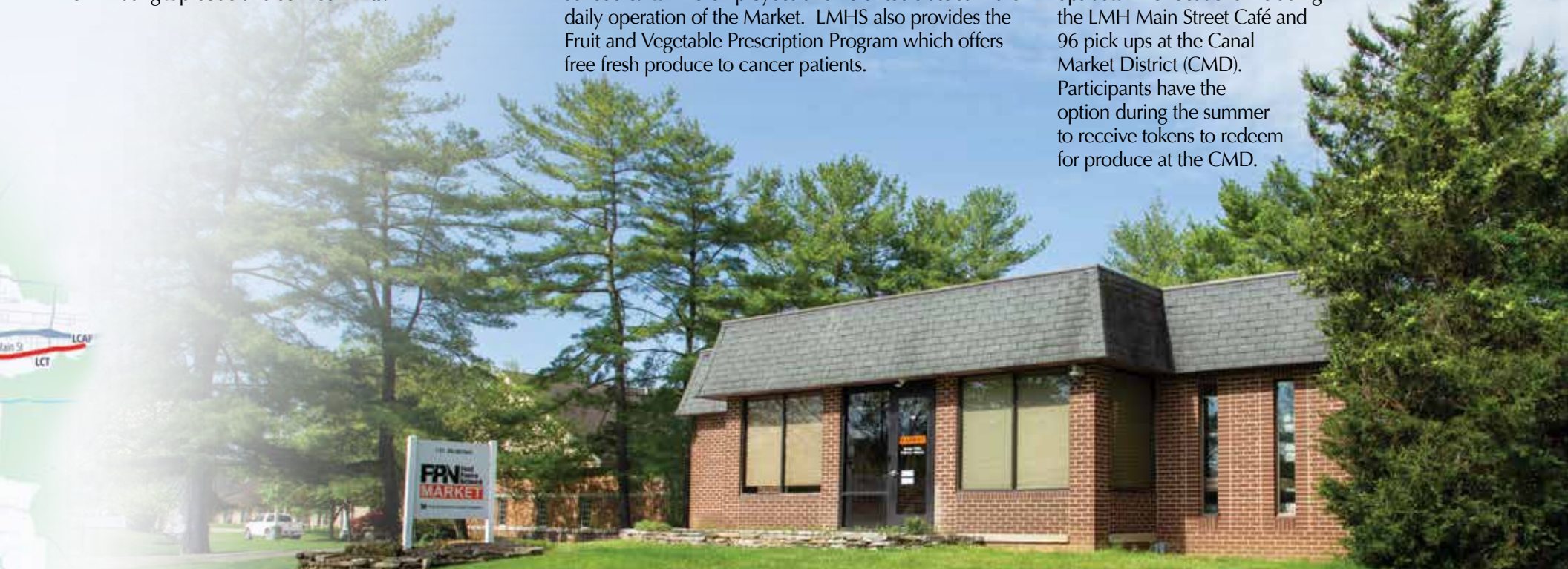


New Licking County Transit Fixed Bus Routes

In addition to transportation needs, LMHS has been working with the Food Pantry Network (FPN) to address food insecurity in the community. The Licking County poverty rate is 10 percent; yet, when factoring in individuals and families who work but are unable to meet the basic needs of food, housing, healthcare, and transportation, the poverty level can be as high as 27 percent. Program changes to the FPN now allows greater accessibility. Changes include increased frequency of visits from monthly to weekly and eliminating zip code and service limits.

To support FPN, LMHS took the initiative to assist in opening the FPN Market. An LMHS building, which is located in an area not previously served by FPN, was donated for use. The Market offers eligible customers a grocery-style shopping experience with a selection of food items including fresh produce, dry goods, dairy, and meat products. The Market is open Monday through Friday, from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and is a stop on the fixed bus route. The extended hours allow customers to visit during a time that best fits their schedule. LMHS employees and volunteers assist in the daily operation of the Market. LMHS also provides the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription Program which offers free fresh produce to cancer patients.

The Licking County community has benefited greatly from LMHS efforts. Last year, the drivers for the LMH Ride Program provided 1,098 rides to physician appointments. The first route established by Licking County Transit that stops along Main Street transported 22,091 passengers in 2024. The FPN Market accommodated 473 weekly visits. The total number of customers served in 2024 was 17,031. Finally, the Fruit and Vegetable Prescription Program had 800 pick ups at LMHS locations including the LMH Main Street Café and 96 pick ups at the Canal Market District (CMD). Participants have the option during the summer to receive tokens to redeem for produce at the CMD.

# Patient Testimonials



## John Morgan – Patient Safety

“In 2021, I lost my wife of 25 years to COVID. I was devastated by the loss and began struggling with depression, which led to me not eating or taking care of myself. I felt very weak and unwell, and my son convinced me to visit the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Emergency Department (ED). I was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) with dangerously low sodium levels. I did not understand the seriousness of the situation. Some amazing people took care of me, and I am grateful to them for seeing me through the crisis. During my stay in the ICU, I was visited by Gabrielle A. Farkas, M.D., and Ashley Frick, B.S.N., who had cared for my wife while she was in the Hospital. They were so caring and kind. Neither of them was involved in my care during my stay; however, when they found out I was in the ICU, they both came to check on me which was encouraging. The staff at LMH is phenomenal. They are very caring, and it is obvious in all that they do.”

## Timothy Welsh – Heart Care

“I have a family history of heart disease, but I believed my job kept me active enough to remain healthy; however, my job became stressful, and I was not following healthy eating habits. A few days before my heart attack, I experienced heartburn, but it subsided. One day when I was at work, the heartburn returned along with feeling hot, unsteady, and confused. This concerned me, so I had the store manager call for an ambulance. The EMS crew performed an electrocardiogram (EKG) on the way to the Hospital. When I arrived, I was taken to the Cath Lab for a cardiac catheterization. Cardiologist Hassan Rajjoub, M.D., performed a coronary angioplasty to open the two blocked arteries discovered during the examination. As soon as the stents were placed and the blood flowing again, I immediately began to feel better. The staff was very good to me. They explained what was happening and what needed to be done. Shortly after my release, I started the Cardiac Rehabilitation Program that Dr. Rajjoub suggested. The staff in the Rehabilitation Program were great and so nice. They knew when to be serious and when to joke to put me at ease. I enjoyed interacting with them. They told me what I had to do to keep my heart healthy, and I have taken their advice seriously. I am so grateful for our community Hospital. Everyone truly cares about the patients.”



## Courtney Ulmer – Maternity Care

“During my third pregnancy, we discovered I was having twins. This also meant that I was at an increased risk of preeclampsia. My obstetrician, Janae M. Davis, M.D., monitored me closely throughout my pregnancy and recommended that the twins be delivered by cesarean section. At 32 weeks, my blood pressure and proteins in my urine became a concern, and I was told that the twins would have to be delivered soon. The staff spoke with me about what to expect and walked me through the procedure. I was even able to speak with the anesthesiologist. She answered my questions and shared her personal birthing experience. The nurses held my hand and baby-stepped me through the process. They put me at ease and worked to make sure the experience would be less stressful. I went to LMH a week later for the procedure. Because the twins were born earlier than 34 weeks gestation, they were taken to the Special Care Nursery. Pediatric Hospitalist John P. Lazar, M.D., explained what care was being provided and gave details about their stay. Everyone was very open. My husband and I were allowed to come and go as we wanted, be involved, and take over care when we wanted. Even though I live closer to other healthcare facilities, I choose to make the 30 minute drive to LMH. I highly recommend the Hospital. Everyone is amazing and provides compassionate care. My twins are doing great, and we are very blessed.”



### **Justin Wolfinger – Diabetes Care**

“After visiting several hospitals for an injury I sustained to my ribs, I went to see Charles L. Geiger, D.O., at Licking Memorial Family Practice – Tamarack. Dr. Geiger ordered laboratory tests, including an A1C test. The test revealed that my A1C level was over 11 percent, and I was diagnosed with diabetes. Further exams showed that I had fractured several of my ribs, and my diabetes was making it harder for my injuries to heal. It was determined that I would require surgery to repair the damage; however, the surgery was not possible as long as my A1C was so high. Dr. Geiger referred me to the Licking Memorial Medication Therapy Clinic where I began utilizing a continuous glucose monitor to help measure my blood glucose levels. The pharmacists helped me to properly manage my medications, and a dietitian worked with me to modify my diet. I learned so much from everyone at the Clinic. I began consuming healthier proteins, and more fruits and vegetables. It did not take long to lower my A1C, and the lifestyle changes have been more than beneficial. I would not have been able to undergo the surgery necessary to repair my ribs without the help of the Medication Therapy Clinic staff. I believe they saved my life.”

### **Robert “Bob” McGaughy – Rehabilitative Care**

“My passion has always been to improve the quality of life in the community in which I live, and I spend many hours working and volunteering with several community organizations, including Licking Memorial Health Systems. Dealing with continuous pain in my knees was making it difficult for me to continue my volunteer work, so I visited Kevin M. Ouweleen, M.D., to discuss treatment options. Dr. Ouweleen agreed that I would benefit from knee replacement surgery for both knees. My first procedure was in October 2023, and the second was in January 2024. After both surgeries, I spent time in the Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit (ARU), and it truly was the right fit for me to successfully recuperate after each knee replacement surgery. The rehabilitation schedule was beneficial because I knew I had no other choice but to perform the exercises and activities provided by the therapists. I do not believe I would have been as disciplined at home. The staff in the ARU were outstanding. The therapists and assistants were demanding yet patient. They encouraged me to push myself in a positive, professional way that made me feel as though I could accomplish the goals they set for me. Overall, it was a great experience. My only regret is that I did not have the replacement surgeries sooner. Dr. Ouweleen is an excellent surgeon and the technology, equipment, and care is of the highest quality.”



### **Sherry Hennen – Surgery Care**

“I began to experience pressure in my throat when I bent over, and I knew something was not right. I made an appointment with my physician, Katrina M. Timson, M.D., at Licking Memorial Family Practice – East. After examining me, Dr. Timson referred me to the Licking Memorial Radiology Department for an ultrasound. The results revealed that my thyroid was enlarged and nodules were present. I was referred to Kenneth C. Parker, M.D., at Licking Memorial Otolaryngology. Dr. Parker is very knowledgeable, and he explained my options including surgery to remove my thyroid. I decided to have the surgery, and it went perfectly. The staff was amazing and very kind. During my follow-up visit with Dr. Parker, he took my hand to comfort me as he told me that cancerous cells were found in three of the nodules. He quickly assured me that he would take good care of me, said I should not worry at all about the findings, and that I would be just fine. Dr. Parker is the nicest, most compassionate physician who cares deeply about his patients.”

# Community Events

Throughout 2024, Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) employees and local residents were invited to events that celebrated LMHS' achievements and areas of growth. These events informed the community about the healthcare environment, communicated our appreciation to community members, and highlighted services. The events in 2024 included:

## Corporate Breakfast

The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council hosted four Corporate Breakfast events in 2024 to inform community leaders about LMHS' services and medical advances. The topics included a recap of 2023...The Year in Review and a Look Ahead to 2024, Social Drivers of Community Health, Comprehensive Cardiac Care, and Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation.

## Active Programs

In 2024, LMHS hosted three events as part of the Active•Fit Youth Wellness Program – Health & Fitness Fest, Junior Chef, and Bowling. During the Bowling event, participants bowled for two hours alongside participants of the Active•Senior Wellness Program. The Active•Senior Wellness Program also featured a number of events, including Yoga, Bingo, Dance, Celebration, Game Show, Brunch Walk, Pickleball, Gourmet Gardener, and Computer Class.

## Caregivers Expo

The LMH Development Council hosted the Caregivers Expo at LMH. More than 200 people attended the event to obtain information from area vendors with available resources that assist families who are caring for aging loved ones, and grandparents who are the primary caregivers of their grandchildren. The event featured 50 vendors, including care facilities, financial institutions, summer camps, and community organizations such as Big Brothers Big Sisters and the YMCA. Additional resources on mental health, family assistance, and healthy living were also available.

## LMHS Summer Camps

LMHS staff devoted their time over the summer to educate local youth about various health topics in fun,

outdoor day camp settings. On June 18, Camp Feelin' Fine participants, ages 6 to 12, gathered to learn more about asthma, manage their symptoms, and interact with others who also have the condition. On July 9 and 10, high school seniors interested in pursuing a career in healthcare were invited to participate in Camp Med. The two-day event consisted of interactive demonstrations and discussions on a variety of healthcare topics. On July 12, LMHS hosted Camp Cool, which is to help youth, ages 6 to 12, explore mindfulness activities. On August 1 and 2, Mind Matters, a mental health camp for youth, ages 12 to 16, featured presentations, group discussions, interactive activities, and crafts that focus on building resiliency, mental strength, empowerment, and growth.

## “For Your Health” 5K Run/Walk & 1-mile Fun Walk

The 2024 “For Your Health” 5K Run/Walk & 1-mile Fun Walk was held on July 20. More than 1,300 residents from Licking County and Central Ohio registered for the 17th annual event. Honorary Chairs were Drs. Brianna and Anthony Johnson.

## Volunteer and TWIGS Recognitions

LMH hosted the annual Volunteer Recognition Dinner on April 9 and the TWIGS Recognition Dinner on May 2 to show gratitude to the individuals who regularly dedicate their time to benefit the Hospital. The 2024 Donald Day Volunteer of the Year Award recipient was Thelma McCurdy. Volunteers delivered 35,088 newspapers, 273 cards and flowers, and completed over 1,295 messenger runs among other activities. In 2024, more than 213 Volunteers and TWIGS members devoted over 25,699 hours serving the Hospital. Awards were presented to 13 TWIGS members celebrating milestone achievements, including Sue Henry-Mounts for 70 years. The TWIGS organizations

provided nearly \$130,000 in donations to LMH in 2024.

## Cancer Survivors Picnic

Approximately 162 Licking County residents gathered on the grounds of the Licking Memorial Medical Campus on June 4 for the 13th annual Cancer Survivors Picnic. The event celebrated and honored cancer survivors for serving as an inspiration to individuals currently receiving cancer treatment, with guest speaker Linda Parks, of the Licking Memorial Hospital Development Council. LMHS President & CEO Rob Montagnese recognized the attending cancer survivors and thanked family and friends for the continued support that they provide to loved ones during their cancer journey.

## Walk with a Doc

LMHS Active Medical Staff physicians were joined by community members as they enjoyed a walk at various locations in Licking County, including Rotary Park and the Buckeye Lake Bike Path. During the walk events, the physicians led discussions on various topics, such as home safety, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and sepsis.

## Family Movie Night

On June 7, LMHS hosted a free Family Movie Night. More than 350 community members attended the event at the Licking Heights High School Outdoor Amphitheater for an evening of active play on a variety of inflatable fun areas. Afterward, attendees enjoyed a viewing of Disney's Aladdin, on a 30 foot-high inflatable screen. ## Be Wise...Immunize

In October, LMHS offered free influenza vaccines to Licking County infants and children. More than 282 youth, up to the age of 18, attended the “Be Wise ... Immunize” Youth Vaccination Clinic at the Gerald K. McClain Building – Downtown Newark and Licking Memorial Pediatrics – Pataskala. Staff members from Licking Memorial Pediatrics administered the vaccines after consulting with the children’s parents.

## Lifetime Achievement Reception

Each year, the LMH Development Council hosts the Lifetime Achievement Reception to recognize those individuals whose actions provide a better quality of life for citizens of Licking County. On November 7, the 2024 Lifetime Achievement Award recipient,

Lou Reese, was recognized for her commitment to education and support of youth in the community, and her philanthropy that has supported numerous organizations and programs throughout Licking County. Created in 1989, the Lifetime Achievement Award is the highest honor that LMHS bestows each year. The 2024 Mary Jane McDonald Building a Healthier Community Award was presented to Friends of the Licking County Library for Dolly Parton’s Imagination Library. The organization was honored for the funds raised to cover the expenses of the program through book sales three times a year, grants, and donations.

## Retiree Events

Each year, LMHS hosts two retiree events, the LMHS Retiree Luncheon and the LMHS Retiree Dinner. At these events, retirees are provided the opportunity to reconnect and share a meal at the Cherry Valley Hotel in Newark.

## Healthcare Expo

On Tuesday, April 2, Registered Respiratory Therapist Kenneth Justice, R.R.T., RRT-NPS, RRT-ACCS, AE-C,

led an informative discussion on the diagnosis, prevention, and treatment of COPD. Living Well with Hearing Loss was held on Tuesday, June 4, where Cheryl Barker, Au.D., CCC-A, of Clear Choice Audiology, hosted a discussion on living well with the challenge of hearing loss and tinnitus, along with an additional discussion on August 6, on disorders of the inner ear and balance. On June 5, Brittany Ward, R.D.N., L.D., of Licking Memorial Hospital Hematology/Oncology Clinic, discussed ways to reduce the risk of several cancers with the nutrients found in plant-based foods. Dining with Diabetes, a four-part course, held on October 3, 10, 17, and 24, educated individuals with diabetes and their families on healthy alternatives in food preparation.

Local religious leaders from Licking County were invited to LMHS for a Pastoral Care Breakfast on Wednesday, May 1. ## Project SEARCH Graduation

For the past eight years, LMHS has hosted Project SEARCH for Licking County high school students who have completed the requirements for graduation, but remain enrolled as fifth-year seniors. The Project SEARCH High School Transition Program provides real-life work experience, combined with training in employability and independent living skills, to help youth with disabilities make successful transitions from school to adult life. The 2024 Project SEARCH Graduation was held on Monday, May 20, as a celebration and acknowledgment of the hard work and achievements of the students.

# Employment

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) has provided employment opportunities for Licking County residents for more than 126 years. LMHS is the primary healthcare provider in Licking County and has an established reputation as the community's leading healthcare provider. This distinction is largely due to the dedication of LMHS' 2,500-plus employees who serve diligently to improve the health of the community.

LMHS has high standards for its employees and believes in recognizing and rewarding their accomplishments through various celebrations, including monthly Dining with the Stars recognitions, employee birthday events, annual recognition events, as well as daily on-the-spot and peer recognition programs. LMHS also offers a comprehensive benefits package that includes a retirement savings plan, tuition assistance, free uniforms, and free access to an employee wellness center, in addition to excellent health, dental, and vision insurance. LMHS also offers a pet adoption benefit. In partnership with the Licking County Humane Society and Licking County Dog Shelter, employees who adopt a pet from either agency can seek reimbursement for the full cost of pet adoption fees.

## 126 Years of Caring at LMHS

In January 2024, employees celebrated 126 years of providing quality healthcare to the community with a donation-themed celebration. Divided into interdepartmental teams, a friendly competition occurred to determine which groups could donate the largest quantity of cold weather items in pounds, and the most monetary donations. After all items were weighed, contributions equaled 165.4 pounds of cold weather items (outerwear, blankets, etc.), while monetary donations reached \$9,862. The collected goods were donated to The Center for New Beginnings and The Salvation Army of Licking County to help needy individuals and families in Licking County stay warm during the cold winter months.
