As for fulfilling the LMHS mission of improving the health of the community, employees and volunteers are encouraged to participate in the many events and activities that LMHS hosts or sponsors. LMHS' annual Red Dress event promotes women's heart health. The "For Your Health" 5K Run/Walk and 1-mile Fun Walk is held each July, and more than 1,600 Licking County and Central Ohio residents registered to participate in 2018. LMHS also has created targeted activities for youth and seniors through the Active•Fit and Active•Senior programs. Licking County youth, including children of employees, participate in

activities that promote wellness including the annual Health & Fitness Fest. Seniors are invited to be more active and social through activities such as the Active•Senior Dance, Celebration event to honor participant achievements, and an educational Game Show event hosted by LMHS President & CEO Rob Montagnese. The Active•Senior Gourmet Gardener event, a collaboration between LMHS and C-TEC, was new in 2018. Seniors visited the C-TEC greenhouse to learn the basics of gardening, then had an opportunity to create a meal using healthy foods from the garden. Employees also responded positively about LMHS community contributions during a survey conducted by Great Place to Work – a survey company partnering with *Fortune* magazine. The organization offers an independent survey of employees to determine the level of positive culture. # Changes, Enhancements and Technology

Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is dedicated to keeping abreast of medical advances and improving the healthcare experience for patients and their families. In many instances, the changes are subtle and take place without public awareness. Changes and improvements at LMHS over the past year include:

## **Maternity Installs Newborn Safety System**

Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) installed a new and innovative Infant Safety System developed by CertaScan Technologies, becoming the first hospital in Ohio to provide this pioneering service to parents and the Licking County community. The proprietary system allows the Hospital to capture high resolution newborn footprints which can be used for precise forensic identification in situations such as abduction, missing individual or natural disaster. The digital identification system for newborns provides an extra layer of infant security and safety with technology that allows for almost instantaneous registration of footprints. Footprints from birth are a recognized and viable means to uniquely identify each baby. CertaScan also provides hospitals and law enforcement officers with 24/7 access to footprint forensic specialists to confirm identities. Additionally, each new mother receives an attractive certificate of her newborn's footprint with the baby's name, birth date and time, weight and height.







### LMHS Medical Campus Expansion

In July 2018, LMHS began construction on a 32,210 square foot addition at the Licking Memorial Medical Campus, located at 1717 West Main Street in Newark. The building is situated on nearly 14 acres of property that was originally purchased in 2004. Currently, the LMHS facility is the location for three medical practices: Center For Sight, Licking Memorial Family Practice – West Main and Licking Memorial Orthopedic Surgery. The West Campus addition, which will mirror the design of the existing building, will serve as the new location for expanded Physical, Occupational and Speech Therapy services to accommodate patient needs. Dermatology and Gastroenterology physician offices, as well as a new Wellness Center, also will be located in the expanded facility. In addition, an extended parking area and an access road from Terrace Avenue are included in the project.

### Laboratory Expansion Offers State-of-the-Art Capabilities

The LMH Laboratory underwent significant renovations and equipment upgrades. The Core Lab, which performs testing for chemistry and hematology, is responsible for the majority of the testing completed in the Hospital Lab, totaling over 5,000 tests per day. A two-year research and evaluation process to select the proper vendor and equipment included demonstration units, allowing staff to test equipment functionality and accessibility. The installation of four new instruments, completed in April 2019, made LMH the only Hospital in the state with this combination of instrumentation and testing capabilities.



### New Nurse Call Light System for Advanced Patient Care

Installation of a new innovative nurse call light system began in 2018. The upgraded communication system enables staff to attend to patient needs in a more timely manner, offering better patient care. The newly implemented patient pillow speaker offers individualized buttons accessible to patients for needs such as water, pain and restroom assistance. Specific lights and notifications ensure the appropriate staff member responds to each call. A touch-screen station in all patient rooms allows for quick, easy access for physicians and nurses to send alerts to other staff members when help is needed. Additionally, a colored lighting system mounted above the door in the hallway designates patients who might need extra assistance for safety reasons, such as a fall risk or concern about infection.



### LMH Radiology Implements Electronic Image Transfers

LMH Radiology Department and Information Systems have implemented a new application to electronically share imaging with other healthcare organizations. Nuance PowerShare allows radiologists to send and receive images from multiple facilities in Ohio. The application has proven to provide improved continuity of care when patients are transferred between healthcare facilities. The Radiology Department's main goals are to cut down on delays in treatment and prevent the re-imaging of patients. When images are received from an outside facility, each are uploaded to the LMH Radiology Picture Archiving and Communication System if relevant to the current visit or needed for comparison.

“After my hip replacement surgery, my family and I began to entertain doubts about what would be involved in my recuperation and rehabilitation, and we realized that outside interim assistance would be needed.

Everyone on the Acute Inpatient Rehabilitation Unit is very reassuring and supportive, readily sharing their pride in your progress. I cannot begin to count the ways in which they all prepared me to go home. My family was so impressed with the staff on the Unit and my positive and successful rehabilitation experience. Both the physical and occupational therapists really made you feel as though you have done them a favor, instead of the other way around. I am so grateful to the kind souls who toil long hours to make life better for the lucky patients who pass through the Unit. Professional and efficient, yet very natural, personable and caring, they believe in you and make sure you can complete a task, even when you do not think you can. I believe I will dance again, if only in my living room, thanks to the staff who cared for me.”



### **Merel Pickenpaugh** – Surgical Care

“On May 2, 2017, just a few days after my retirement, the three, 3-inch stainless steel screws that had been in my left hip for more than 50 years were removed and a left total hip replacement was performed. It proved to be difficult, as the bone had grown over the screws, which were in the exact location that the bone had to be cut for the new prosthetic pieces to be properly placed. It was like removing old rusty nails from concrete and dislocation of my femur was necessary to effectively remove the pins. The entire process was executed remarkably. I began physical therapy on my second day



of recovery in the Hospital. They were very thorough with their care, performing a home assessment before my discharge and providing extremely helpful exercises. I am so pleased with the outcome of my procedure. Being pain-free is a tremendous improvement. Andrew Terlecky, D.O., is an excellent surgeon with a wonderful bedside manner. Additionally, the nurses were accommodating, caring and professional during my stay. I could not say anything better about the staff.”

### **Jennifer VanBuren** – Maternity Care

“Halfway through my pregnancy, I was diagnosed with gestational diabetes. At my regular 36-week checkup, I was being monitored and awaiting my discharge papers when I began having Braxton Hicks contractions. Medical staff noticed that the contractions were putting my baby in distress and immediately contacted neonatal specialists at Nationwide Children’s Hospital to discuss my situation. I believe the attentiveness to my situation up to this point and observant manner at my appointments saved my son’s life.

I was admitted to LMH and spent two days under close observation before physicians decided to induce labor preterm to remove my baby from possible further distress. However, complications continued, and Lanson was delivered by emergency cesarean section and taken immediately to the Special Care Nursery where he spent about 12 hours with respiratory support. Janae Davis, M.D., was so reassuring and comforting to me during some very confusing and upsetting moments. Everyone was very considerate and did their best to make sure my baby and I were safe.”

# Fundraising

Charitable donations help Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) proactively respond to the growing healthcare needs of the community through the incorporation of the latest technological advances. To ensure that funds are available for equipment purchases, capital expenses and facility improvements, the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Department works diligently to raise contributions to Licking Memorial Health Foundation (LMHF). The contributions provide capital for projects and programs that may otherwise go unfunded and are not used for salaries or general operating expenses.

In 2018, LMHF supported the installation of a new state-of-the-art nurse call light system at LMH that ensures a rapid alert process notifying physicians and staff of a patient's condition and needs. A touch screen station in all patient rooms connected to LMH's electronic medical record will allow the staff to quickly access important information about the patient's care. Physicians and nurses can use the system to send alerts to other staff members when help is needed. The system also will be used in conjunction with a colored lighting system mounted above the door in the hallway to designate patients who might need extra assistance for safety reasons, such as a fall risk or concern about infection.

**Community Cornerstone Club** – The Community Cornerstone Club is comprised of individuals and businesses who contribute \$100 or more to LMHF. In 2018, the Cornerstone Club had 218 members who raised \$37,325 toward the nurse call light system at LMH. Donors receive a Main Street Collection recognition piece at each \$500 milestone of giving. The 2018 addition to the Main Street Collection, a replica of LMH – Tamarack, recognized donors who have reached the \$10,000 level of giving.

**The Caduceus Society** – Physicians have a special opportunity to lend financial support through The Caduceus Society, which is a prestigious giving level for physicians who pledge a gift of \$10,000 or more over a period of 10 years. New members in 2018 included: Dr. and Mrs. Chuck C. Cho; Sean and Mae Gallagher; The Hagele Family; Drs. Karen Smith-Silone and James Silone; and Dr. Hinsta A. Tewoldemedhin and Family. Personalized bricks are available in two sizes and are placed in one of LMH’s exterior walkways. A total of 10 commemorative bricks were purchased and placed on the grounds in 2018.

**Honorary and Memorial Giving Program** – Many community members appreciate the opportunity to pay tribute to a loved one, commemorate a special event or celebrate a recovery through monetary contributions that benefit LMH. In 2018, LMHF received three honorary and 46 memorial donations.
