What Is an Electrocardiogram?

An electrocardiogram is a graphic recording from the heart's electrical impulses. It is a painless procedure and does not require an IV. The test typically takes 5 to 10 minutes. A cardiologist will read the test.

How Do I Prepare for This Test?

- No preparation is required for this test.
- It is best not to use oil-based lotions on your skin during the day of the test.

How Do I Register for an Electrocardiogram?

Please report directly to Cardiology, located on the Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Second Floor. No appointment is necessary. If arriving after 3:30 p.m., please report to registration on the LMH First Floor.

What Can I Expect During an Electrocardiogram?

- Small plastic tabs called electrodes are placed on the chest, arms, and legs.
- The wires from the EKG machine are attached to the tabs.
- The EKG machine will print a review of your electrical impulses.

What Should I Do After the Test?

You may drive yourself home and return to your normal activities on the day of the test.

How Do I Obtain My Results?

You will find out the results from the doctor who ordered the test. Please allow 24 to 48 hours for your test results.
