We are pleased to present our 2005 Annual Report to the Community. As you read this report, you will see that we have expanded services and added new technology to various areas. We continually strive to improve patient safety and to help control costs.

The year 2005 was exciting in many ways, and we were pleased to start construction of a 90,000 square foot Critical Care Pavilion, which will provide both a new Emergency Department and Surgery Department. Construction of the Critical Care Pavilion is estimated to be complete by late 2007.

In 2005, Licking Memorial Hospital became one of a few hospitals nationwide to earn the ISO 9001:2000 certification. This certification serves as a basis to improve quality awareness and employees' understanding of roles and responsibilities.

We are especially proud to announce that Licking Memorial Hospital was named in late February 2006 as one of the nation's 100 Top Hospitals® for a seventh year! Licking Memorial Hospital is one of only three hospitals in Central Ohio to make the list this year and one of 16 in the state to earn the distinction. Nationally, only eleven hospitals have received this prestigious award more times than Licking Memorial.

This past year, we expanded our services by opening two new Licking Memorial Family Practices – Heath and Hebron. We now have physician offices located in Granville, Hanover, Heath, Hebron, Johnstown, Newark, Pataskala and Utica. Our goal is to offer high-quality health care services to the citizens of Licking County in convenient locations.

We look forward to serving you in 2006 and beyond. We hope you will enjoy our 2005 Annual Report.

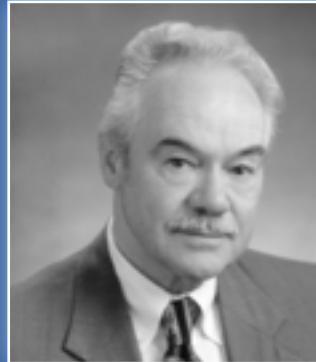

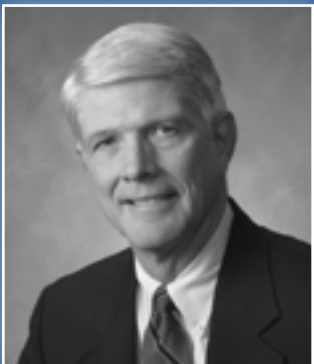

# Services ...

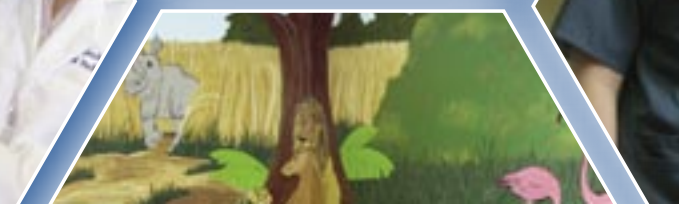
Information technology remains a priority for Licking Memorial Health Systems to provide better patient care, improve efficiency and reduce costs. Mobile computers and an electronic medical record for the Emergency Department were added in 2005. Additionally, state-of-the-art isolettes were installed in the Nursery, and a new digital echocardiography system was implemented in Cardiology for improved image quality.

The Oncology Department at Licking Memorial Hospital was expanded in 2005. This provided patients with more privacy and comfort. Updated infusion chairs were added as well. The new décor was designed for patient comfort and relaxation while receiving infusion treatment.

The Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Department was improved in 2005. New patient care equipment was purchased and installed, providing up-to-date technology for modalities, physical conditioning, strength-building and isokenetic exercises.

Two new locations were added for Licking Memorial Health Professionals (LMHP) in 2005: Licking Memorial Family Practice – Heath and Licking Memorial Family Practice – Hebron. Additionally, LMHP expanded services at the Pataskala Health Campus in 2005 by adding Licking Memorial Women’s Health and Licking Memorial Pediatrics. Licking Memorial Geriatrics, a new LMHP practice, which specializes in treating the elderly, began in 2005.

The Licking Memorial Pediatrics office moved from 66 McMillen Drive to a new location at 1865 Tamarack Road to better accommodate patient needs. Colorful and fun murals that include tropical fish, monkeys, giraffes and other exotic wildlife were painted on the walls as part of the new area.



# Achievement ...

Licking Memorial Health Systems takes pride in having an award-winning hospital. Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) earned certification for ISO 9001:2000 standards in 2005, which is rare for hospitals. ISO 9001:2000 requires process approach, customer focus and continual improvement. To attain the ISO 9001:2000 certification, LMH underwent a week-long audit, and several staff members in many areas participated in interviews with the auditors.



# Sharing ...

The mission statement of Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) is to “Improve the Health of the Community.” LMHS certainly lives up to that mission by co-sponsoring events and making donations – such as used vehicles – to other organizations. Some sponsorships include school sports teams and other youth activities to promote healthy lifestyles. In addition, Licking Memorial Health Systems matched employee donations to help Hurricane Katrina survivors.

Classes are offered to the community at the Hospital throughout the year to educate people about prevention, early detection, symptoms and/or treatments of various diseases. Some of these educational programs include free screenings for those attending the event. During 2005, many speakers provided information to area groups through the Development Council’s Speakers Bureau. Licking Memorial Health Systems participated in health fairs throughout Licking County in 2005 offering various health screenings and health information. Monthly screenings are also available at the Licking Memorial Mall Walker Program held at the Indian Mound Mall.







# Critical Care Pavilion

On June 24, 2005, Licking Memorial Hospital broke ground for construction of the Critical Care Pavilion, a 90,000-square-foot, two-story addition that will provide a new Emergency Department and Surgery Department.

In June, new parking lots were constructed to replace ones that would be torn up to make way for the Pavilion. During this time, many trees in front of the Hospital (including the historic "Liberty Pete" tree) were marked with orange mesh to indicate that they would be preserved – still others were moved to new areas.

In July a new outpatient entrance and sidewalk were constructed to allow patients direct access to the CardioPulmonary Department. The patient drop-off canopy at the former Emergency Department entrance was demolished.

Changes began in August as backhoes and bulldozers removed truckloads of topsoil and dirt, which was stored on nearby LMHS property to be used later for backfilling and landscaping. Digging began for the 195 concrete piling that reached 40 to 50 feet into the ground to support the Pavilion's foundation. A new driveway entrance to the Emergency Department opened directly off McMillen Drive for emergency squad vehicles and walk-in patients. Large red-lettered signs were posted to direct the rerouted Hospital traffic.

In September, progress was less obvious to observers, although the crews diligently continued in preparing the site. The supportive auger cast piles were completed, and work began to top them with poured concrete caps. Foundations were poured for stairwells.

October marked a milestone in the Pavilion's construction with the pouring of the first walls.

Also on the basement level, steel rebar were installed on top of the pile caps to reinforce columns.

The underground plumbing was laid in November. Concrete was poured for stairwell walls, elevator walls, and inner wall footers. Even frigid temperatures that arrived in



December did not stop the Pavilion's construction. Concrete masons continued to pour columns, walls, and the first sections of the basement floor. In many instances plastic sheeting and gas heaters were used to ensure the concrete cured properly.

In January 2006, the Critical Care Pavilion's basement walls were completed, and concrete was poured for the first level floor. Dump trucks began to bring back the stored dirt to use in backfilling around the basement walls. Concrete was poured to extend the height of columns, elevator walls and stairwell walls up from the first level.

Motorists on Main Street could finally see the Pavilion's progress in February 2006. Previously, most of the construction had taken place below ground level. Now formwork was set up for the second level's floor, and the shape of the addition was visible.

The Critical Care Pavilion project is estimated to be complete in late 2007. The construction is on schedule and within budget as of March 2006.

The new Emergency Department will increase the number of rooms to improve patient flow and decrease wait times. The new department will include larger private rooms, a dedicated trauma elevator, a CT scanner, and a dedicated emergency squad entrance.

The new Surgery Department will be upgraded to increase privacy, both pre-operatively and post-operatively for patients who come in for surgery. The new area will accommodate interventional procedures and other future technological advances.

The Critical Care Pavilion will feature a two-story atrium with a courtyard view that will allow an easy, accessible entrance for Outpatient Surgery and other special procedures. A café on the first floor of the Pavilion will offer a peaceful setting for patients, families and visitors.

Turner Construction Company is managing the Critical Care Pavilion project. Trinity Health Group is the project architect.



# Fundraising ...

The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council was established in 1987 to increase charitable giving to LMH and to enhance and promote meaningful community relations for the Hospital. Approximately 75 volunteers serve on various committees. This group is the foundation of LMH's success because it is dedicated to ensuring that the latest advances in medical technology are available to the citizens of our community.

Community leaders who serve on the Development Council have diverse backgrounds and expertise. They are interested in Licking Memorial Health Systems and committed to its mission of improving the health of the community. The members are ambassadors for the Health Systems and educate the community about the many accomplishments and successes made throughout the year.

## Three main fundraising events took place in 2005:

- **Golf Gala:** The Licking Memorial Hospital (LMH) Development Council sponsored the 2005 Golf Gala on Monday, June 13, 2005, at Moundbuilders Country Club. One hundred fourteen golfers enjoyed a beautiful day, making the event a huge success.
- **Community Cornerstone:** A reception was held on October 18, 2005, to thank those individuals in the community who have supported LMH by pledging an annual gift of \$100 or more. The LMH Development Council founded the Community Cornerstone Club in June 1987 to recognize their deep appreciation for Licking Memorial supporters. Individuals who reach different giving levels receive various pieces from the "Main Street Collection."
- **PRIDE:** Licking Memorial Health Systems (LMHS) employees displayed a lot of PRIDE (Providing Resources In Dedicated Employees) by participating in the employee fundraising campaign, which generated funds for the new Emergency Department waiting room.



Fortunately for the community, the Hospital is able to construct the new Critical Care Pavilion without placing a financial burden on the citizens. However, there are a number of giving opportunities within the project for individuals who would like to contribute to purchasing state-of-the-art technology or even naming a part of the project.

In addition, members of the Development Council are soliciting donations for the Caduceus Society, Schaffner Society and the Alford Fellowship. Contributions are also being accepted for the Cornerstone Club and Honorary and Memorial Giving. 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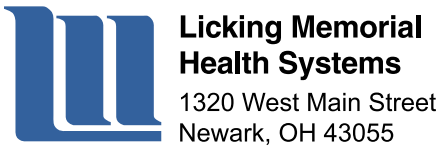
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
